#### Times of the school day and attendance letters

As part of the government's continued push to return attendance levels to those before the Covid Pandemic (yes school attendance levels have still not recovered!) we will continue to write to families where their child's attendance shows concerns of being too low. Parents choosing to send their children to school for their education, must ensure that they attend. This includes Reception aged children. Where attendance is likely to be a concern parents may also be asked for a meeting with myself and/or Mrs Cunningham. In some cases there may be unavoidable reasons, such as a period of illness, and attendance data would be improved easily by attending more fully throughout the rest of the year. Where there are unauthorised absences or patterns of absence appearing, this raises a concern on the system to which we need to make a response.

Please also remember that we open our gates at 8.20am. The school day starts as soon as the children enter the classroom, so those arriving after 8.30am are already behind and missing school. We leave the gates open so parents can leave, not so children can arrive late... please get here on time. From term 4 the gates will close at 8.35am, so if you always arrive at the last minute, please consider your morning routines so you can get here 5 minutes earlier on February 19th.
