<u>Music</u> – Victorian performance and composition

Children will perform a song inspired by the industrial revolution and sing with control and confidence. They will also listen and appraise a variety of different pieces of music.

History - Victorians and the railway

The children will find out key information about the Victorian period before studying how the railways changed Swindon. They will use a variety of sources to find out about how life changed at this time and communicate their understanding in a variety of ways.
