Annual attendance at 95% means a child would miss:
more than a third of a year, over their time at AMCPS.

Annual attendance at 90% means a child would miss:
almost \(\frac{3}{4} \) of a year from their primary school years!

This year, 53% of children managed to attend school for between 96-100% of the time. Without the impact of STREP A in the younger age groups, it would be even higher. However, an increase from 38% to 53% is excellent progress in one year!

We also increased the number achieving Gold from 80 to 147 children, another excellent outcome.

We are sure these figures will continue to improve in the new school year. Send them in... we will send them home if needed!

Congratulations Hornbeam, you improved from 33% to 75% of children winning an award - finishing top this year!

The government has published more new guidance on how schools will be held to account if attendance nationally does not improve, but also outlining prosecution of parents as a real alternative for local authorities.

We need to get our children in school to increase their chances of achieving their best possible outcomes.

See above for the impact of missing a few days! Whilst 90% sounds high, it equals $\frac{3}{4}$ of a year lost over a child's time at Primary School. We are sure 2023-2024 will continue to show improved data and thank you for your help.

The recent Ofsted (May 2023) states the school is Good overall with Outstanding areas, but more importantly parents and children reported the school as GREAT and AMAZING.


