The children performed really well and spoke clearly as they acted out scenes from their stay. Hopefully parents were tuned into our X (Twitter) account or the website to see all that was happening,





Discos Next week - Organisation Reminders

Here are some reminders about the organisation of discos. All children enter via the community room door next to the car park / Nursery gate. Please don't come to the front door!

We ask that:

- Children are brought to the outside community room door for entry (and we look after them from there)
- You take coats home with you and bring them back when you collect.
- All children of ALL AGES must be collected by an adult. No child will be allowed to leave without an adult collecting them. Basic principle - No Adult = No Discol
- Collect, at the end of each disco, from the front door!
- Please be on time when collecting, even if you have a child joining the next disco - it just delays it for everyone else.
